### Dear Parishioners and Friends of All Saints, Boyne Hill,

Firstly, thank you for all the support given during Holy Week to help the church celebrate the most important week in the Christian calendar. Special thanks to Jo Towers and the team of ladies who worked so hard to make the church so beautiful for the Easter Vigil and Easter morning. So many people commented that the church looked spectacular on Easter morning.

This was the first time since 2019 that we had as a church community been able to celebrate Holy Week and Easter Day at All Saints. It was wonderful on Easter morning to see so many people present again following the struggles, that not just All Saints, but many church communities have encountered through the Pandemic. It was an absolute joy to see the church with the George Street floor returned to its former splendour, the flowers looking beautiful and the church pretty full.

It was a joy as well to celebrate Easter morning with a genuine All Age service with a good number of families present. It was lovely for me to have children sat at the front of the church to share an interactive talk for the first time in years unless you count our outdoor BBQ's and services last year.

During the talk I asked people to tell me the words for saying goodbye in their native language. It was amazing to hear languages from Tonga, Iran, Japan, France, Spain, Poland, India and of course English. Following the service, we discovered that there were people from South Africa, Cyprus, Belgium, Caribbean Islands, Zimbabwe, Ghana and even a lady who had left her home at 5.00am that morning to be with her family having travelled from the Mumbles in Swansea! It will not have escaped your notice that we had prayers led by Tanya from Russia. One lady by the name of Mei who has been sharing a 16 week confirmation course comes from Japan and she reminded me that her sister lives in Israel and so the word Shalom has special significance for her. Thank you to everyone who is welcoming the people joining us from Iran at this time. We hope to continue supporting them with hospitality and helping them learn more of the English language.

In a week where some of the services had small congregations it was amazing to share the Easter Resurrection with people from all round God's world.

## WORSHIP FOR SUNDAY 24 APRIL THE SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

### COLLECT

Almighty Father, you have given your only Son to die for our sins and to rise again for our justification: grant us so to put away the leaven of malice and wickedness that we may always serve you in pureness of living and truth; through the merits of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit one God, now and for ever. Amen.

### NT READING Acts 5: 27 - 32

When the temple police had brought the apostles, they made them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, saying, 'We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you are determined to bring this man's blood on us.' But Peter and the apostles answered, 'We must obey God rather than any human authority. The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Saviour that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.'

### GOSPEL John 20: 19 - 31

It was evening on the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.' But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.' A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.' Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

There are nomination forms at the back of the church, if you wish to nominate someone as a candidate in any of these elections. You need to be on the Electoral Roll to take part in these elections.

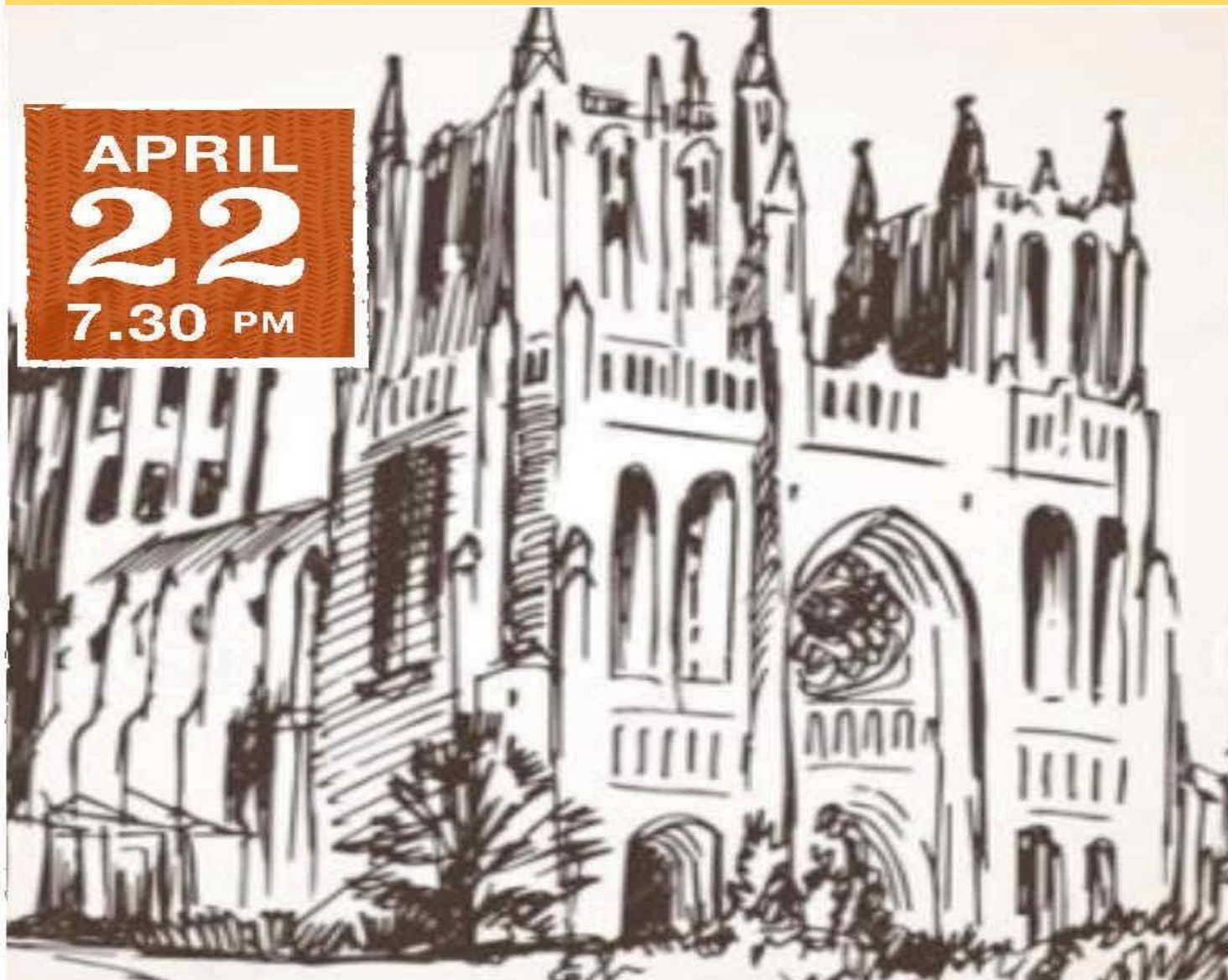
