Church Bells Update

The bells should have rung on Friday for the first time since the end of June for the funeral of John Elliott. It was the Elliott family's hope and wish that they would be rung to celebrate John's long life and his many years service to All Saints. On Wednesday 8th August the bellhangers were able to remove the clapper to take to their workshop in Oxfordshire to repair/renovate and re-bush to reinstall back into the No 5 bell for normal ringing. They were able on their first visit to carry out the repair and replacement of the bearings of No 5 bell in situ and it was back on the frame ready for ringing before they left on the 8th

(except for its clapper). They were scheduled to return on 16th and refit the clapper and carry out some other much needed maintenance work. So all that will be required now is to pay the bill and give thanks for their skills and thanks to all involved in getting our bells back ringing again in a relatively short period of time. The local ringers will next be ringing the bells for Sunday service on **2nd September**, unfortunately apart from the funeral where we were able to borrow ringers from other towers a few of our ringers are away leaving us insufficient to ring before 2nd September.

Ride & Stride Berkshire Churches Trust's ("BCT") annual fund raising event is on **Saturday 8th September.** For those of you not familiar with this it is one day in the year when many Churches across Berkshire will open their doors for visitors arriving on foot or on their bikes. These "Riders and Striders" are sponsored for the number of Churches they visit during the day with the money raised going to BCT for their valuable work in supporting local Churches; All Saints has benefitted from this support in the past. Importantly, 50% of the sponsorship money raised by anyone from All Saints will come back to us.
