EPISTLE Ephesians 4: 25 — 5:2

Putting away falsehood, let all of us speak the truth to our neighbours, for we are members of one another. Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and do not make room for the devil. Thieves must give up stealing; rather let them labour and work honestly with their own hands, so as to have something to share with the needy. Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear. GOSPEL John 6: 35, 41 — 51

Jesus said to the crowd, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.' Then the Jews began to complain about him because he said, 'I am the bread that

came down from heaven.' They were saying, 'Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, "I have come down from heaven"?' Jesus answered them, 'Do not complain among yourselves. No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me; and I will raise that person up on the last day. It is written in the prophets, "And they shall all be taught by God." Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me. Boyn Hill Road Closure Monday 13th to Wednesday 15th August

Please be aware that the road outside the church (Boyn Hill Road) down to the Bath Road and in the other direction connecting with Wootton Way is to be closed for resurfacing for approximately three days (weather conditions permitting and other factors).

If you are coming to the Wednesday morning Eucharist you will be wise if travelling by car, to come via the Bath Road or you may get through from Boyn Hill Avenue. If you cannot park in Boyn Hill Road you may consider parking in Westmorland Road or Boyn Hill Avenue. **Be Warned** these roads have parking restrictions so please make sure that you do not fall foul to these; we would not want you to incur a parking fine.
